1) DRNI Hot Topics in Dementia Research

May saw two webinars taking place as part of the DRNI Hot Topics in Dementia Research series.

Dancing with Dementia - An exploration of dance as an intervention for persons with dementia was a fascinating and toe-tapping tour of the research work in the area of dance interventions. Carmel McKenna, Munster Academy of Dance, Jennifer Moran Stritch, TUS and Sean Donal O'Shea, ASI spoke about their research and dance interventions, and Niamh Kelly, TUS Athlone spoke about her PhD research.

Economics of Dementia and Brain Health saw Dominic Trepel, TCD, explore the fundamentals of health economics in relation to dementia and brain health. He was followed by Daniel Araya and Men Hoang, both PhD students at TCD, who provided the opportunity for participants to deep-dive into the areas of model-based economic evaluation and discrete choice experiments.


3) Dementia Trials Ireland - National Dementia Trial Mapping
