2) DRNI at the Neuroscience Ireland conference

DRNI were invited by Neuroscience Ireland to co-host a session on "New Horizons in Alzheimer's" together with the Alzheimer Society of Ireland on 30th August, the second day of their biennial conference which took place in the beautiful setting of RCSI.

The session started off with a lively and insightful panel discussion on public person involvement in research. Led by Dr Diane O'Doherty of the Alzheimer Society of Ireland, panel participants Kevin Quaid, Helena Quaid and Kevin Cullen from the Dementia Research Advisory Team shared their insights and expertise of PPI involvement as persons living with dementia and as carers, while Dr Derek Costello, Assistant Professor of Neuroscience at UCD provided his experience of PPI involvement as a researcher. The panel discussion was followed by Professor Sean Kennelly of Tallaght University Hospital/Trinity College Dublin who spoke on the changes in diagnosis and treatment of Alzheimer's Disease.
