2) DRNI Early Career Researcher Day

On October 10th DRNI hosted an Early Career Researcher Event in St James's Hospital, Dublin. Attended by almost 80 participants and ECRs from across the island of Ireland, the event saw oral and poster presentations from all areas of research in dementia. The posters and presentations were judged by panels of experts, including a specific PPI judging panel made up of PPI representatives. Awards were given in a number of categories, including Best PPI Engagement.

The event also featured a panel discussion on funding with participants from Health Research Board, Science Foundation Ireland, Horizon Europe, Alzheimer Research UK, and Dementia Trials Ireland.

The Abstract Book from the event showcases the depth and breadth of the research undertaken by Early Career Researchers in Ireland and Norther Ireland -- it is a very interesting read and can be accessed <u>HERE</u>. 3) Alzheimer Society of Ireland: report from the Research Knowledge Exchange Seminar

Knowledge Exchange Event, bringing together early-career and experienced researchers, clinicians, people living with dementia and family carers to explore this topic.

This event provided an opportunity to share knowledge and expertise within the dementia research community and hear from others on collective challenges and solutions for research translation. 4) UCC Centre for Gerontology and Rehabilitation: CPD module

The Centre for Gerontology and Rehabilitation, University College Cork offer two flexible, interdisciplinary programmes, run by Professor Suzanne Timmons: *Dementia* and *Older Person Rehabilitation*.

There are three streams of study available for each of the two courses listed above:

- 1. Masters
- 2. Postgraduate Certificate
- 3. Individual CPD modules

The programmes are both available full-time or part-time and can be tailored with a wide range of optional modules. Most modules for both courses are delivered as blended-learning and therefore suit students who wish to study remotely and commute for the in-class workshops.

Applications are currently being invited, and the next intake of the programmes will commence in January 2024.

For semester 2 of the current academic year, there are four modules open for registration as CPD modules:

- Module: CG6002 <u>Stroke Rehabilitation</u> [closing date 8th December 2023]
- Module: CG6006 <u>Falls, Mobility and Movement Disorders</u> [closing date 15th February 2024]
- Module: CG6016 <u>Advanced Issues in Dementia Care</u> [closing date 22nd February 2024]
- Module: IP5001 <u>Holistic Approach to Palliative Care</u> [closing date 7th January 2024]

5) Alzheimer Society of Ireland: The Experience of Dementia in Ireland A Snapshot in Time Report

As part of World Alzheimer Month, The Alzheimer Society of Ireland launched their report The Experience of Dementia in Ireland: A Snapshot in Time. The national report captures the experience of living with dementia in Ireland in 2023, highlighting the multi-faceted and complex challenges facing those affected by the condition.

The new research was carried out in early summer with almost 670 people, including both carers and people living with dementia. Many people are struggling with issues such as burnout, isolation, mental and physical health against the backdrop of the Cost of Living Crisis. This national research illustrates the scale of need and the increasing demand for services nationwide.
