#### 1) Brain Health ARC Scotland - Bio-Hermes Data

<u>Brain Health ARC Scotland</u> are inviting applications from research teams to work with Bio-Hermes data. The Bio-Hermes study dataset comprises of 80,000 multimodal dementia biomarkers including data on blood biomarkers, CSF, genetics, proteomics, cognitive tests, imaging and clinical.

Brain Health ARC have streamlined the data access process, and provide additional support to allow researchers who have ideas for a project or want to access the data to focus on the science and the data. Applications are welcome from institutions in Ireland and Northern Ireland, however collaborations with Scottish universities are especially encouraged. Brain Health ARC are happy to help connect Irish applicants to Scottish teams to help create such collaborations.

# 2) NDS update on Implementation of National Clinical Guideline No. 21

The <u>implementation programme</u> for National Clinical Guideline no 21 (Appropriate prescribing of psychotropic medication for non-cognitive symptoms in people with dementia) commenced in 2022, and the <u>National Dementia Service</u> has circulated the following updates.

The 30-minute module "Support pathways for people with non-cognitive symptoms of dementia" is available on HSeLanD. This module is targeted at all staff who provide care to people with dementia, provides important information on non-cognitive symptoms of dementia, tailored person-centred support, and risks of psychotropic medication.

## Resources for staff involved in the prescribing of psychotropic medication

- A <u>prescriber information leaflet</u> provides an overview of the recommendations and good practice points of National Clinical Guideline No. 21, information on comprehensive assessment, and signposting to additional resources and information.
- A <u>document to support comprehensive assessment</u> has been developed to provide answers to a number of frequently asked questions in relation to this.

# Information guide for people with dementia and their family carers and supporters

An information guide for people with dementia and their family carers and supporters is now available in both a <u>Plain English</u> and <u>Easy Read</u> format. Both versions explain what psychotropic medications are, when they might be prescribed, provides information on the possible side effects of using these medications, highlights the importance of regular reviews of the medication, and signposts to additional information.

#### **Facilitator Education Programme**

The Facilitator Education Programme is a one day programme of education (accredited by the NMBI) for staff who wish to become Local Facilitators for the Implementation of National Clinical Guideline No. 21. Local Facilitators are provided with ongoing support from the Implementation Programme Team in the National Dementia Services. #### 6) DCU Dementia Champions Microcredential module

Dublin City University have re-launched their Dementia Champions Microcredential module.

A a flexible blended educational option with 2 full days in DCU and on-line education, the module is designed to make a deep change in the way we see people with dementia and interact with them.

The module takes a person-centred approach and covers a number of core themes in dementia care from the assessment of memory problems and early interventions, care in the community and palliative approaches to dementia. It focuses on skill development in several key therapeutic approaches and assessment strategies.
