

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# EMERGING RESEARCH: DEMENTIA AND SPEECH AND LANGUAGE THERAPY



**Dr. Suzanna Dooley** is a Clinical Specialist Speech and Language therapist in communication and dementia, based in the MASS clinic in St. Columcille's Hospital. Her teaching, practice and research focuses on the assessment of cognitive communication disorders in dementia and the development of communication interventions for people with dementia and their supporters. Suzanna will speak on her work and research in the Memory Clinic as well as recent and planned research in the area of conversation coaching with people with dementia including those with primary progressive aphasia.

**Lisa Sheridan** is a Clinical Specialist Speech and Language Therapist within the Institute of Memory and Cognition in Tallaght University Hospital (TUH), with a particular interest in language and cognition and vast experience in assessing complex communication difficulties as part of the Regional Specialist Memory Clinic (RSMC) in TUH. Lisa will discuss assessment of speech and language skills in a memory service and will focus on research trends examining the use of speech and language features as digital biomarkers for identifying changes in cognition.

# 3) National Dementia Service: Brain Health

The **National Dementia Service** (NDS) are working to reduce, prevent or delay the onset of dementia in a person, by tackling modifiable risk factors for dementia. One such strand of work is that around brain health, where the NDS are working in a number of different ways:

- The National Brain Health Expert Working Group is an example of a successful partnership approach between the NDS, HSE Health and Wellbeing Services, DoH, healthcare professionals and academia. The focus of the group is to raise awareness of brain health and dementia risk factors and link dementia with other programmes, policies and campaigns on noncommunicable disease risk reduction and health promotion.
- The **Think Brain Health webinar**: "Discover how healthy behaviours support your incredible brain" was hosted by HSE Healthy Ireland and the National Dementia Services. **Sarah Mc Cormack**, HSE Healthy Ireland Lead, Health & Wellbeing was joined by **Dr. Sean O'Dowd**, Consultant Neurologist, TUH and Clinical Lead, NDS along with other expert panellists to discuss our brain and the healthy behaviours we can adopt to look after it. You can watch it back HERE.
- There is also a Think Brain health podcast in which Dr. Sean O'Dowd,
   Consultant Neurologist at TUH, and Clinical Lead, NDS, explains the functions

the need for increased awareness of brain health and dementia risk factors and speaks about the positive impact of physical activity, social engagement, and cognitive stimulation on brain health. You can listen to the podcast <u>HERE</u>.

• The Brain Health working group has commissioned a **Brain Health research study focused on women** aged 18+. The study aims to understand public awareness and knowledge of dementia risk factors and the importance of maintaining a healthy brain in order to reduce the risk; explore health behaviours in relation to brain health and dementia risk reduction, openness to them, as well as barriers and enablers; and provide insights that help the HSE make decisions on how best to support and communicate to the public to help them reduce their risk of dementia. The research includes expert interviews, an online survey and focus groups. Findings will be published in Q1 2025.

Launched in July 2021, this service makes it easier for people to get involved in research and offers a safe, supported environment for them to explore participation options. The service currently has over 350 members. An **in-depth evaluation** of the service will now be conducted. # 5) AllHPC - Early Career Research Forum


